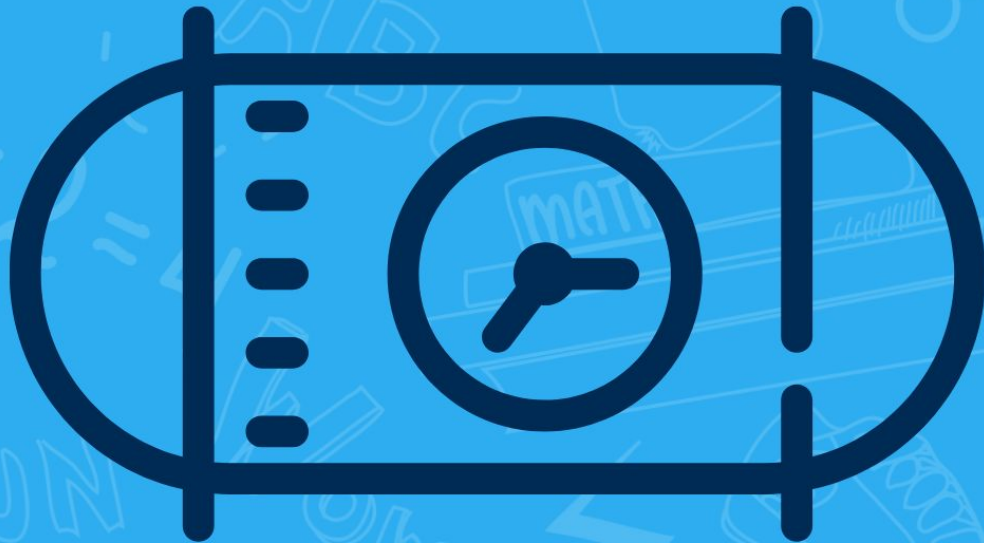

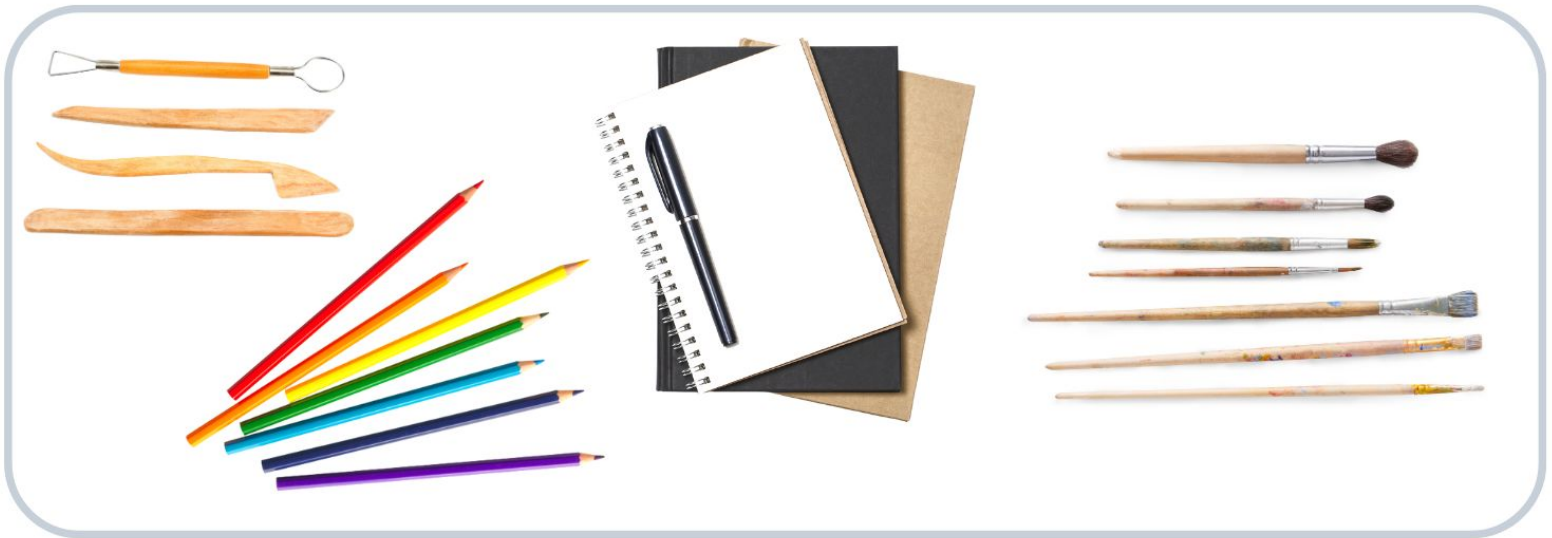

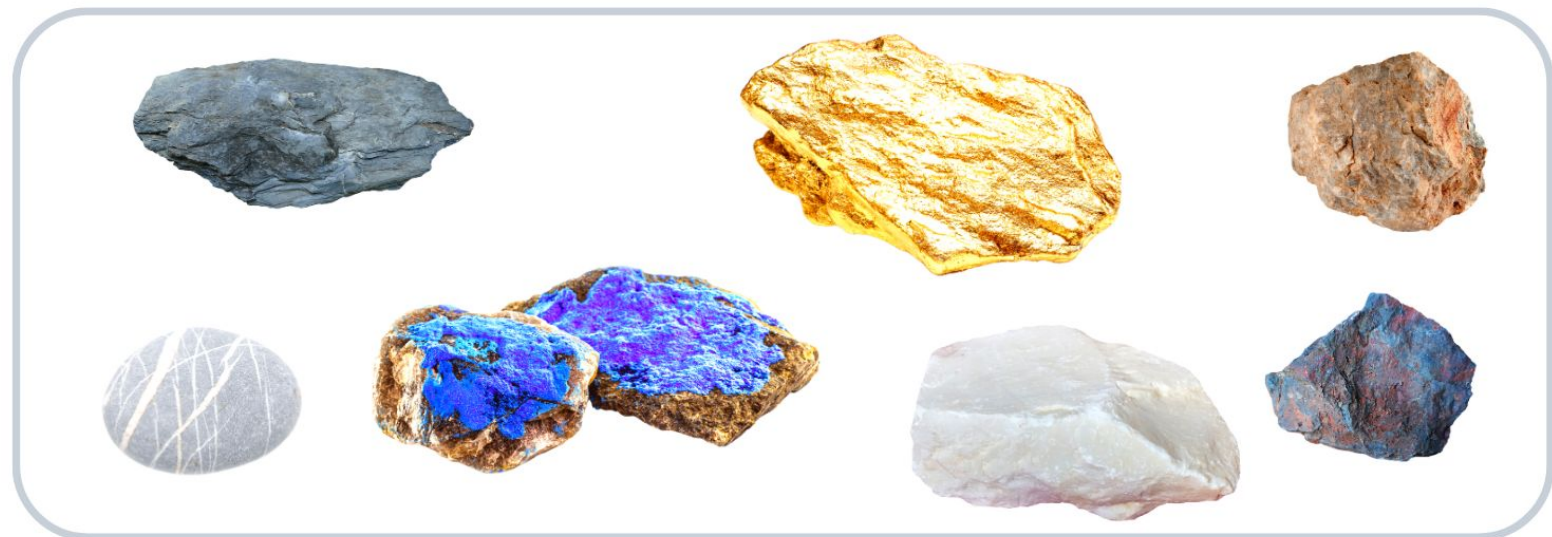
A.2 What's the Message?


Letter 2
